# **Cat Care Volunteer**

### **Description:**

The Animal Care department is responsible for the daily care, feeding, cleaning and monitoring of all animals in the shelter. Along with daily hands-on care, Animal Care is also responsible for ensuring the shelter is sanitized and organized. Cat Care volunteers assist with these duties for the cats.

### Objective:

To assist Animal Care Technicians with the daily care, feeding and cleaning of cats in the shelter. This position involves physical labor and direct animal contact and interaction.

# Supervision:

Directly reports to the Volunteer Coordinator. Indirectly reports to Animal Care Supervisors, Lead Animal Care Technicians, the Shelter Supervisor, and Shelter Manager. Works closely with and receives training from Animal Care Technicians.

# Requirements:

	Cat Care Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age		
	Volunteers over the age of 18 must complete a national criminal background check and sex offender search		
	Volunteers must complete 8 hours in cleaning & enrichment prep before starting Cat Care training		
	Ability to read animal body language and respond appropriately, as well as maintain a calm and quiet attitude at		
	all times - no loud talking, no agitated or quick movements		
	Read and understand signage in the kennel area and around the shelter		
	Respond quickly and appropriately to verbal instruction and conduct duties without unnecessary disruptions to		
	staff or clients		

#### **Cat Care Commitment:**

Cat Care Volunteers must be able commit to a minimum of 2 hours per week for a minimum of six months.

# **Working Conditions:**

All volunteer work will be performed in the animal shelter setting. There is a potential for exposure to zoonotic diseases and cleaning chemicals, exposure to dangerous and fractious animals, exposure to high noise levels when in kennel area, and a potential for animal bites and scratches while handling animals. Please note that you will be handling cleaning chemicals and animals so be aware that clothing may get dirty.

### **Physical Activities:**

Lifting of up to 50 pounds unassisted; kneeling, squatting, bending, cleaning kennels (scrubbing and mopping), handling animals of all temperaments, animal restraint

Providing daily care for cats. This may include feeding, filling out daily logs, cleaning kennels, assessing basic feline health, and knowing when to inform Animal Care staff of an animal's health status and behavior Understanding and applying knowledge of cleaning protocols and thorough disinfection process when cleaning animal areas, dishes, laundry, and crates Using personal protective equipment (PPE) to prevent fomite and disease transmission in a shelter environment Following organizational animal handling policies and safety protocols at all times
